### Information for the people who are involved in the review

(for the adult, their family or anyone else who is helping)







#### What Is A Safeguarding Adults Review?



A Safeguarding Adults Review can be called a SAR.



A SAR is when people look at how everyone worked together to keep someone safe.

#### Why Do We Do A SAR?



The law says we might have to do a SAR when someone dies or is seriously harmed.







### Only some people would have a SAR.

#### The SAR helps us understand:



- What went wrong
- What worked well
- How we can improve

#### Who Will Do The SAR?



People who were not involved with the SAR but understand what good care and support is.



There may be lots of different people who are involved in the SAR like the police, doctors and different managers.





#### How Will We Do The Review?



We will have meetings.



We will ask lots of different people to give us information to tell us what happened.



We will ask someone who does not know the adult to help us see what went wrong, what went well and what needs to change.









#### **How Can You Help Us?**



If someone has hurt you or your family member has died



You will be asked to tell us what you think happened.



What you think needs to change.



Your personal information like your name will not be in the report.
